

# How to Adopt a Rabbit 1·2·3



**1 Learn** about rabbit care.

Read the **Before You Adopt** pamphlet at the entrance to the rabbit area and the **Did You Know?** poster. Ask questions about rabbits.

**2 Visit** with the rabbits before adopting: spend time with each rabbit (or bonded pair) in an exercise pen. Adopting a rabbit is a 10-year commitment!

Read the **yellow info cards** on the cages. Ask about the bunnies' personalities. This is especially important if you are looking for a friend for your single bunny - rabbits can seriously injure one another if it isn't a good match.

**3 Adopt!** You pay the adoption fee of \$56 while your bunny goes for a final veterinary exam. You can also have your rabbit microchipped for an additional \$15.

Most of our rabbits are neutered prior to adoption. If your bunny isn't already neutered, volunteers will transport to the neuter clinic. You will pick your bunny up from the shelter after s/he has been neutered.

Every rabbit adopter receives an **adoption gift bag** with transitional food, toys, care information and coupons, and a **free bag of hay**.
